ACCOUNTING POLICY

1 Method of Accounting

Mercantile system of accounts is followed using historical cost convention

2 Investments

Investments are stated at cost of acquisition less permanent diminution (if any). All investments are long term investments.

3 Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at Historical cost less depreciation.

4 Depreciation
